

BACKYARD CLOTHES DRYING

What is permitted under Rule 9.0 – Clothes Lines

Our Rules and Regulations permit residents to use **portable, umbrella-type clothes dryers in their backyards**. This means you can enjoy outdoor air-drying while keeping the equipment portable and independent of buildings and fences.

✅ PERMITTED

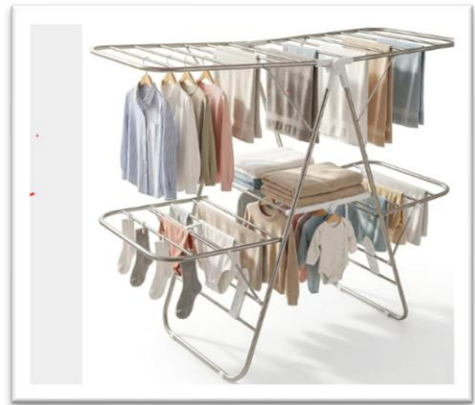
Portable, umbrella-type clothes dryers

A permitted dryer should be:

- **Portable and freestanding**
- **Umbrella/rotary style**, with folding arms
- Able to be removed or stored when not in use
- **Independent of the building and fences**

Examples include freestanding umbrella-style or rotary drying racks such as those shown below.

❌ NOT PERMITTED

Clotheslines attached to buildings or fences

The following are **not permitted**:

- ❌ Clotheslines attached to a fence
- ❌ Clotheslines attached to the house or other building
- ❌ Retractable clotheslines mounted to a wall or fence
- ❌ Permanent clothesline systems attached to structures
- ❌ Any other clothesline that requires attachment to a building or fence

The simple rule to remember

PORTABLE + UMBRELLA STYLE = YES 👍

ATTACHED TO A BUILDING OR FENCE = NO 🚫
